

THE DANCE OF THE BANKSIA WICKS


The design of The Hedberg carpet was inspired by a story that was shared with the building's architects while walking along a windswept East Coast beach.

Above the sound of crashing surf and the cry of gulls, they learned how the first Tasmanians transported fire by enclosing dry, smouldering banksia cones inside two abalone shells. Wrapped in bull kelp, the shells were carried from hearth to hearth and it was law to share the fire with any rival group who requested it.

Influencing the design of The Hedberg, a place where creativity is celebrated and cultural knowledge is shared, architects at Liminal and WOHA brought the symbolism of a shimmering opalescent shell to the building's exterior and the warmth of burning embers to its interior.

The collaboration between Liminal and Tasmanian Aboriginal artist Michelle Maynard weaves the colour of glowing coals into the design of the unique carpet. Its rich hues and fluid markings create the foundation for the meeting and gathering places of The Hedberg community.

The Theatre Royal Main Stage is a resilient theatre that is not only an iconic piece of Tasmania's history but a living home for the performing arts.

An intimate 700-seat theatre that has seen Laurence Olivier, Noël Coward, Vivien Leigh and Marcel Marceau tread the boards, welcomes today's artists to do the same.

THEATRE ROYAL PRESENTS TAKARA NIPALUNA

takara nipaluna - 'Walking Hobart' is the first and only Aboriginal tour of nipaluna/ Hobart.

This walk of nipaluna and its waterfront follows the route taken in 1832 by a group of 40 members of the Aboriginal resistance, as they progressed to the old Government House to negotiate an end to the Black War. takara nipaluna - Walking Hobart - gives voice to the palawa (Tasmanian Aboriginal) perspective and continued presence within this modern city, exposing the layers of history beneath the asphalt.

BANGARRA DANCE THEATRE, IN ASSOCIATION WITH THEATRE ROYAL, PRESENTS

WUDJANG: NOT THE PAST





In the deep darkness just before dawn, workmen find bones while excavating for a dam. Among the workers is Bilin, a Yugambeh man, who convinces his colleagues to let him keep the ancestral remains. This ancestor is Wudjang, who, along with her young companion spirit, Gurai, longs to be reburied in the proper way.

Combining spoken storytelling, live music and the astonishing choreography for which Bangarra Dance Theatre is internationally renowned, *Wudjang: Not the Past* is an epic-scale new co-production featuring 17 dancers, four musicians, and five actors.

Directed and co-created by Bangarra's Artistic Director Stephen Page (*Bloodland, The Secret River, Bennelong*), and featuring Mibinyah language from his home on Yugambeh Country, this ambitious and powerful piece of performance illuminates the ways in which ancient traditions continue to guide and strengthen current and future generations of First Nations people.

Funny and incredibly moving, Black Cockatoo is a new artistic collaboration between iconic Australian writer Geoffrey Atherden (Mother and Son, Babakiueria) and recent Sydney Festival Artistic Director Wesley Enoch (Black Diggers, The 7 Stages of Grieving).

More than 150 years ago, 13 brave Aboriginal men in Western Victoria picked up their cricket bats and embarked on a treacherous voyage to England and into the unknown - all in the name of sport. Risking illness and persecution, Australia's first international cricket team - including Australia's first Indigenous sporting hero, Johnny Mullagh - amazed the English crowds with astonishing talent, personality and grit. They should have returned to Australia as celebrated heroes. Instead, they came back to find the world they once knew was no longer there.

This is not just a story about cricket – this is a story of strength, resistance, hope and possibility. When a group of young present-day activists sneak into the Wimmera Discovery Centre to expose the truth of what happened to Johnny and his teammates, a hidden legend of triumph and tragedy unfolds.
